Mrs Jones has been teaching Italian to most of the Yr 7 Italian classes at the Griffith site with Mr Catanzariti covering the remainder.





Yr 9 Drama have been working on their acting skills and learning about the history of theatre and the style of Commedia dell'Arte.



Yr 11 Drama have begun their HSC course with a study of contemporary Australian theatre through the play "Stolen" about the experiences of the Stolen Generations.



Students in the Drama Passion elective have been working on improving their improvisational skills and film making.

Students in Junior Music have learnt to play the guitar and keyboard, learnt about rock music and the instruments of the orchestra.



Yrs 9 and 10 Music have worked well this semester on improving both their performing and listening skills. They have completed various activities which included analysing and performing selected repertoire.

Miss Lawler included a practical lesson where students were making use of aquafaba (the water in which legumes have been cooked). Students were able to use this product which is usually discarded to make a delicious Veg-an Chocolate Mousse.




Yr 10 Food Technology have also recently completed their Food Trends Assessment Task where they needed to work as a food stylist. Students were given 7 Chocolate Ripple Biscuits that they needed to style and present the biscuits for an advertisement to be used in a trade magazine. Students needed to capture a digital image of their work and submit to the Google Classroom.

Yr 11 Community and Family Studies students have been busy with their Research Methodology Unit. Students are completing Independent Research Projects (known as IRP) on topics of their choice. The student will conduct their own primary research from using questionnaires, surveys or interviews to help them discover or find out something on a topic that interests them.

Yr 9 Food Technology have recently completed their Assessment for Food Product Development where students were tasked to develop a new 'movie long' snack to entice movie guests and help promote a movie. Students made their products in class.



Yr 10 Visual Arts have been completing mixed media designs for the Human Consumption Practical task. Meanwhile Yr 9 Visual Arts are learning about shutter speed on cameras with water bombs!! Such fun lessons.



As the year draws to a close, classes will be focusing on doing a few Christmas themed practical tasks to finish up 2020 – something to look forward to.
